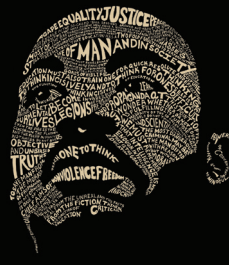

This is a community partnership with the YMCA and Tacoma Public Schools.
